EHV-1 BIOSECURITY PLAN

The EHV-1 Biosecurity plan has been elaborated according to the FEI Post EHV-1 Return to Competition Regulation of 9th April 2021 in orderto allow the return to competitions and protect horses and equestrian sports from the consequences of infectious diseases transmitted before during and after FEI events. Assessment of the biological risk related to the sudden emergency linked to the spread of EHV-1.

Italy is declared by the FEI one of the Countries that need measures to allow return to competitions in total safety after the spread of the EHV-1 HERPES virus. This Biosecurity plan wants to offer preventive and protective measures aimed at minimizing the risk of contagion.

This important document must be brought to the attention and acknowledged by anyone authorized to enter the Longines FEI Endurance World Championship 2021 in Pisa (ITA).

INTRODUCTION

General Description

The EHV virus occurs in 4 different types that affect 4 different systems of the horse, in this case the most lethal and contagious is that of type 1, said also EHV-1.

The most common form is type 1 which affects the respiratory system of the horse. In the most common form, it presents respiratory diseases with variable symptoms that include fever, nasal discharge, swollen lymph nodes, cough, loss of appetite and significant physiological drops, which are quite common symptoms and can be misleading and alarming those who observe the horse.

In more serious cases, the Herpes Virus can also have repercussions from a neurological point of view, leading to paralysis and death.

Method of transmission

The EHV--1 virus, also known as Rhinopneumonia, has a very high viral load and is very easily transmitted by air, by direct contact between horses and also through surfaces that have come into contact with the viral components. For this reason, both sporting events and daily life in individual stables can be dangerous if the necessary precautions are not taken. It is possible, however, that horses spread the Equine Herpes Virus even without showing clinical signs (the so-called asymptomatic carriers), transmitting it only in certain environmental conditions such as stress, transport and competitions.

Diagnosis

Observing symptoms, especially at the respiratory level, cannot always lead to a correct diagnosis of

rhinopneumonia, so in these cases it is categorically recommended to contact a veterinarian who can evaluate all the hypotheses. Using a classic swab or serological tests, it is possible to establish whether a

respiratory infection is associated with EHV--1, by taking two blood samples 10 days apart on which the

antibody titration is carried out.

Treatment and convalescence

Unfortunately, being a virus, there is no specific and targeted cure. Treatment of equine herpes virus

respiratory infections usually consists of supportive therapy, as human anti-herpes drugs are not effective in

horses. Antipyretics and antitussives are administered, but also antibiotics to prevent or fight secondary bacterial infections, and to shorten the recovery period. However, with the help of a veterinary expert, a cure

can be identified to treat the symptoms resulting from EHV-1 such as general weakness, loss of appetite and

apathy. It is possible to preserve his respiratory health in a preventive manner through alternative methods

recommended by us such as purified hay. However, in summary, the only remedies are prevention and the

vaccine.

Prevention

In order to reduce the incidence of EHV-1 infection and to minimize its spread, it is necessary to sanitize the

living environments of horses combined with particularly thorough hygiene through disinfectants.

The isolation of the horse and tools is mandatory in case of contact with the virus.

The prevention of contagion depends on the probability that horses have of coming into contact with the

virus emitted by a sick person or a healthy carrier (a healthy carrier is defined as the person who, even if contaminated, does not show symptoms or because it is too early to manifest them or because will never

manifest being able to eliminate the virus autonomously).

In compliance with the provisions of the FEI, the Ministry of Health, the General Directorate of Animal Health and the FISE, the Event Director identifies a method of control and management of the risk for the event and informs the participants about the procedures for managing the risk inherent in the contagion and transmission of the EHV-1 virus.

The participants in the competition, their crew members, the Staff, the Officials correctly informed by the President have the responsibility of respecting the behaviours defined by the regulations in force and by the rules laid down by the OC with this document.

Risk EHV-1

Risk control is divided into three phases

PHASE 1: RISK ASSESSMENT - The first risk assessment must be carried out individually by each horse owner / athlete who will have access to the Championship by estimating the risk index associated with their own horse based on the venue structure, maps and obligatory routes to follow.

PHASE 2: RISK MANAGEMENT - All the procedures aimed at permanently removing or constantly containing the criticalities identified in the risk assessment phase.

PHASE 3 RISK COMMUNICATION - All actions aimed at informing, training and raise awareness about horse health advice before and during the event.

PROCEDURES FOR CONTRASTING EHV-1 INFECTION

- 1. Correct behaviour of the riders within the place of the event.
- 2. Visitors must strictly comply with the instructions given by the O.C. which are considered accepted from the moment of registration
- 3. Correct information and awareness of correct behaviour is considered the first and most important means of managing risk.
- 4. The OC will have to provide suitable signs, encouraging the dissemination of messages and raising awareness of behaviours.
- 5. In order to inform and train the athletes and their crew, Officials and all the staff, correct information on the correct behaviours to prevent the spread of the EHV---1 virus must be visible in the Office:
- a. obligation to wash hands with gel at the entrance and exit of the stables
- b. obligation for horses to drink water by individual containers
- c. obligation to read well this document in order to be properly informed about the procedures for fighting the infection
- d. obligation to record the horse's temperature at least in the 10 days prior to the event in the FEI form
- e. obligation to measure and record the temperature twice a day in the appropriate cards prepared by the O.C. outside of the box
- f. obligation to observe the entry and exit from the stables as indicated by the O.C.
- g. obligation to carefully observe the distance from other horses of at least 5 m.
- h. obligation to saddle the horse inside the assigned box and to use only personal harness

Any information the Event Director deems useful for risk management.

Personal Hygiene

The correct application of preventive measures, such as hand hygiene, can reduce the risk of infection. The

OC provides special dispensers of alcoholic gels with an alcohol concentration of 60---85%

Emergency procedure in case of entry into the center of a horse suspected of EHV-1

If a horse exhibits the symptoms of the EHV-1 virus, the VSM will immediately arrange the movement to the isolation area prepared in advance by the O.C. and will proceed with the provisions of the Veterinary

Regulations. The C.O. will arrange for the immediate disinfection of the box used.



REGULATORY PROTOCOL FOR THE CONTAINMENT OF THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

PREMISE

The objective of this Regulatory Protocol is to provide organizational and operational indications aimed at increasing the effectiveness of the precautionary containment measures adopted to combat the COVID-19 epidemic. The measures indicated follow the logic of protection and implement the provisions of the Italian Legislator and the indications of the Health Authority.

Compliance with national and local legislation on hygiene and health indications aimed at preventing the spread of the Covid-19 virus is an essential premise of this document.

The Recommendations of the World Health Organization, the Italian Ministry of Health and the individual Italian Regions and Autonomous Provinces are and will be considered a reference point in the application of these Measures and of this Operational Protocol Events-Events in the period of Covid-19. Document reviews may be progressively adopted and disseminated in relation to the progress of the Covid-19 pandemic. This document is aimed at allowing the event called "LONGINES FEI WORD CHAMPIONSHIP 2021" CH-M-E, in compliance with priority health protection needs related to the risk of spread from Covid-19.

The indications provided in this protocol concern the organizing committee and the operators involved in the organization. They are also temporary in nature, and closely linked to the emergency as well as to the possible issue of other more specific guidelines by competent authorities.

INTRODUCTION

General Description

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses known to cause illnesses ranging from the common cold to more serious illnesses such as Middle East Respiratory Syndrome (MERS) and Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS).

The World Health Organization (WHO) announced on 11 February 2020 the new name for the new coronavirus disease: Covid-19. The name is the acronym of Co (crown); Vi (virus); D ('disease') and 19 (the year the virus was identified).

The virus causing the current coronavirus outbreak has been called "SEVERE ACUTE RESPIRATORY SYNDROME CORONAVIRUS 2" (SARS-CoV-2). This is a new coronavirus strain that was never previously identified in humans before being reported in Wuhan (China) in December 2019.

The disease has an "incubation period" or the period of time that elapses between the infection and the development of clinical symptoms. It is currently estimated that it varies between 2 and 11 days, up to a maximum of 14 days.

The most common symptoms of a person with COVID-19 are fever, fatigue, and a dry cough. Some patients may experience muscle aches and pains, nasal congestion, runny nose, sore throat, or diarrhea. These symptoms are usually mild and begin gradually. In severe cases, the infection can cause pneumonia, severe acute respiratory syndrome, kidney failure, and even death.

In this regard, some people become infected but do not develop any symptoms. Symptoms are generally mild, especially in children and young adults, and slow onset. About 1 in 5 people with COVID-19 become seriously ill and have breathing difficulties, requiring hospitalization.

Method of transmission

Coronaviruses can be transmitted from person to person, usually after close contact with an infected patient, such as between family members or in a healthcare setting.

The new Coronavirus responsible for COVID-19 respiratory disease can also be passed from person to person through close contact with a probable or confirmed case.

The new Coronavirus is a respiratory virus that is spread mainly through close contact with a sick person. The primary route is the droplets of the breath of infected people for example through:

- saliva, coughing and sneezing
- direct personal contacts
- hands, for example by touching contaminated (not yet washed) hands with your mouth, nose or eyes
- In rare cases, the infection can occur through faecal contamination.

Respiratory diseases are not normally transmitted with food, which in any case must be handled respecting good hygiene practices and avoiding contact between raw and cooked foods.

No virus is capable of living and reproducing outside of a living being (man or animal), but for a limited time it can survive outside (it is believed that the Coronavirus cannot survive more than a few hours outside the host, but the data are still uncertain given that COVID-19 is a new virus and still not sufficiently known and studied).

True prevention of contagion depends on the likelihood that people have of coming into contact with viruses emitted by sick people or healthy carriers (healthy carriers are defined as those who have been contaminated by the virus without showing symptoms or because it is still early to manifest them or because they will never manifest them being able to eliminate the virus).



Person in charge of complying with all the protection and prevention measures from Covid - 19 contagion provided for in the protocol and regulations in force throughout the course of the event, as well as the only covid-19 contact person present on site: Mr Gianluca Laliscia

The event does not foresee the presence of the public and will be accessible only to professionals. With the clarification that:

- The venue is a large open space that allows for abundant air changes.
- The organization of the event, considering the large spaces provided, does not produce a compressing crowding effect.
- There is and should not be any reason for physical contact between the staff involved in the organization and during the performance of the horse parade
- If the event also hosted other people, who are not part of the organization of the event, the dedicated spaces must be identified and separated to avoid any opportunity for contact with the operators of the event, as well as other people unrelated to the event.
- Preliminary information activities for the event will be carried out for all operators, athletes, members
 of the teams who will deal with the event for various reasons. During the information activity, these
 subjects will be adequately made responsible for the behaviours to be followed to reduce the risk of
 contagion
- This document aims to analyse the critical issues associated with the COVID-19 risk during the event and to identify the control and management methods to be applied in order to reduce and / or eliminate the contagion risk.
- For the management of the specific emergency, reference is made to the emergency and evacuation plan.

GENERAL PREVENTION AND PROTECTION MEASURES

The prevention and protection measures are aimed at managing the risk of contagion for the entire duration of the event. They must be adopted bearing in mind that the prevention and protection measures are not to be understood as alternatives to each other, but as minimum equipment in order to prevent contagion in relation to the current epidemiological situation in progress.

1 - MAIN CONTAGION PREVENTION MEASURES TO BE ADOPTED IN CONTINUITY FOR THE WHOLE DURATION OF THE EVENT:

- a) SOCIAL DISTANCE: Throughout the event, compliance with the rule that people are at least ONE METER away from each other will be guaranteed. When such distancing will not be possible. In order to ensure interpersonal safety distancing throughout the course, the Organizers must:
- Identify the paths of the operators, as well as any accompanying persons and / or suppliers;
- favour staggered entry / exit times in order to limit crowds in common areas as much as possible. Differentiate where possible the entry points to the structure from the exit points.

The Tenuta di San Rossore in Pisa is a very large and closed area included in the Migliarino San Rossore Massaciuccoli Regional Park. The area has never been evaluated by the competent authorities as a "red zone".

Both the playing field and the track are safe and locked areas, completely closed to the public and / or to any other external interference.

The amount of people will be managed within the relevant areas:

- Access to the Vet Gate will be allowed only to the Athlete and to 1 of the 4 crew members available (yellow bib)
- Access to the cooling area will be allowed only to 2 of the 4 crew members available (yellow bib)
- Access to the crew points will be allowed only to 2 of the 4 crew members available (red bib)
- In the stable area, access will be allowed to a maximum of 2 people per horse at any time. The number of the crew is limited to 2 plus the Athlete for the duration of the event.
- Only 1 crew member per horse to participate in the start.
- At the finish line, Athlete and Horse will follow a fenced and protected path that from the finish will lead them to the cooling area.
- **b) CONTINUOUS USE OF PPE** (Personal Protective Equipment): mandatory surgical masks for everyone and availability of easily accessible disinfectant gel for hand disinfection.
- c) HEALTH CONTROL AT ENTRANCES: health control methods will be applied such as body temperature control and territorial supervision with personnel responsible for checking the correct use of masks and any other PPE.

The request for event accreditation for all participants is mandatory by 10 May 2021.

At the entrance of the venue there is a manned access equipped with a barrier.

This will be managed by qualified and informed staff on all access regulations with a dual task:

- verification of accreditations
- temperature detection and acquisition of self-certifications

Given the importance of thermoregulation, at the gate of the stables the same check will be repeated by the personnel of the Italian Red Cross specifically authorized to do so.

Within the area there is a **Medical Center chaired by the Italian Red Cross** to carry out first aid functions and to facilitate the return of delegations from foreign nations to their countries of origin.

Within this Medical Center, a service of two types of swab test will be made available:

- the first of the rapid antigenic type with results in about 20 minutes
- the second of the molecular type. In this case, the swab will be sent to a certified laboratory which will respond within 24 hours.
- d) CLEANING AND SANITIZATION: this activity will be carried out before and during the event. Specifically, the following will be sanitized: seats, equipment, work tools, bathrooms. Will be made available in the bathrooms: sanitizing gel, disposable wipes, alcohol-based disinfectant and disposable wipes for cleaning the toilet seat. The operators who carry out the cleaning and sanitizing work must imperatively be equipped with all clothing and personal protective equipment. The cleaning and sanitation actions must include activities performed using products having the characteristics indicated in the circular no. 5443 of 22 February 2020 of the Italian Ministry of Health.
- e) MANDATORY EMERGENCY PLAN: procedure aimed at the safe management of the case in which a person experiences fever above 37.5 °C and Covid-19 symptoms. The procedure will provide for the identification of a suitable place for isolation and assistance by specially trained personnel equipped with PPE to be used for contact with the potentially infected person. The Italian Red Cross will take care of this management for the entire duration of the event. After the end of the emergency phase, the person in charge must remain isolated and dispose of personal protection in a special airtight bag. If possible, in addition to washing his hands, he will have to leave the venue, wash his own person and change his clothes.
- **f) INFORMATION OBLIGATIONS**: Information is provided to all operators and anyone who accesses the event for various reasons, in relation to the Covid 19 emergency. Appropriate horizontal and vertical signs and / or brochures will be posted at the entrances and in the most visible places.

The key information provided is:

- the obligation not to be able to enter and / or remain in the area of the event in the case of dangerous conditions (symptoms of flu, temperature, coming from areas at risk or contact with people positive to the virus in the previous 14 days, etc)
- the obligation to maintain an interpersonal safety distance of at least 1 meter
- the obligation to use the mask systematically and continuously
- the obligation to respect the rules of hygiene by frequently washing hands or sanitizing them with hydroalcoholic solutions
- clinical features of COVID-19 and preventive measures, in particular respiratory labelling and hand hygiene practices
- criteria for asking people with symptoms to leave the venue or retire to a designated area
- information on the obligation of physical removal
- The need to communicate in advance the time of arrival at the place of the event (message to n. +39 333 8101296 at least 1 hour before arrival)
- The obligation to communicate the names of those authorized to enter by 10 May by sending the accreditation and privacy form signed by each person
- The obligation to provide a self-certification at the entrance stating that the following symptoms of COVID-19 have not occurred in the last 14 days and no awareness of contact with people who have tested positive for COVID-19
- The obligation to measure body temperature with a ban on entry if the temperature exceeds 37.5 °
- Any information that the Covid Event Manager deems useful for risk management, in relation to the individual specificities that may arise during the event and that the Covid Event Manager, as identified above, will evaluate from time to time

Guidance for the use of the

WHO Risk Assessment tools in the context of COVID-19 - FEI version

Guidance for FEI Event organisers ("OCs") during the current outbreak of COVID-19

In view of the current outbreak of COVID-19, this disease-specific and event-specific risk assessment and mitigation checklist has been developed by WHO for use by host countries and event organizers, to assess the specific risk of COVID-19.

The FEI has slightly adapted the wording in the document, mainly by replacing the initial term "mass gathering sporting event" by "FEI Event". Under the FEI Policy for Enhanced Competition Safety during the Covid-19 Pandemic, which applies to all FEI Events taking place after 1 July 2020, all OCs of FEI Events must carry out a risk assessment of their Event in terms of Covid-19 transmission, using the present document.

The following risk assessment and mitigation checklist should be used in conjunction with the "WHO Mass Gathering Sports Addendum Guidelines" - OCs should consider the term "mass gathering" in it as synonym of "FEI Event" in this context.

In order to accurately provide answers the following risk assessment and mitigation checklist, OCs must be knowledgeable on the current COVID-19 outbreak. OCs should reference the daily global COVID-19 situation reports provided by WHO as well as the national COVID-19 situation reports, if available.

The tool must be completed in this Excel spreadsheet (see following tabs), as the scores are automatically calculated there. Once the tool is completed, the scores received in the Excel spreadsheet for both sections will appear in the decision matrix found on the final tab ("Overall risk scores") for the Event's overall risk score to be determined.

It must be ensured that this risk assessment is conducted with input from local public health authorities and that the necessary personnel with expertise in mass gatherings, risk assessment, epidemiology, and infectious disease control measures are included from the initial stages of planning.

For the final determination, factors under consideration include:

- the current stage of the COVID-19 outbreak and known transmission dynamics
- the geographical distribution and number of participants, and their individual risk profile
- the risk assessment tool
- the mitigation measures that are currently in place or feasible and any discipline-specific guidance issued by the FEI.

It is important to remember that while mitigation measures can reduce the risk of COVID-19 infections, they cannot completely eliminate the threat. It is WHO's view that all countries with community transmission should seriously consider postponing or reducing sport events that bring people together and have the potential to amplify disease, and support the recommended best practice of physical distancing. Any decision will be supported through the use of WHO tools, in particular this risk assessment tool.

If movement restrictions and further national measures have been established in the country, the risk assessment does not apply.

However, when the process of re-opening/conducting mass gatherings is being considered post movement restrictions, it will be key to ensure any decisions are based on a risk assessment, such as the WHO Mass gatherings COVID-19 risk assessment.

Risk assessment for COVID-19

The questions below will enable OCs to review the additional considerations specific to sports, and thus inform their risk assessment of COVID-19 associated with their Event. This will help OCs understand and manage any additional risk from COVID-19.

The risk assessment should be reviewed and reassessed regularly during the planning phase and updated immediately prior to the transition to the operational phase, especially in light of the rapidly evolving nature of the outbreak. Reference should be made to the latest technical guidance and situation reports on the WHO website.

The risk assessment for COVID-19 associated with the Event must be coordinated and integrated with the host country's national risk assessment for COVID-19. The person completing the questionnaire should include input from the local public health authorities, consult WHO's latest technical guidance and ensure that there is an up-to-date evaluation of the epidemiological situation.

Mitigation checklist for COVID-19

Mitigation measures assess the current effort and planning to reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 disease for the event. As mitigation measures can reduce the overall risk of the sporting event contributing to the spread of COVID-19, they should be taken into account after the risk assessment has occurred to gain a clearer understanding of the overall risk of transmission and further spread of COVID-19, should the event be held. Together with the risk assessment score, the mitigation measure will contribute to the decision matrix and influence the assessment of the overall risk of transmission and further spread of COVID-19 in relation to the event.

IV. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

- 2) an ATA form, especially for extra European Countries or in the case the horse will pass through not EU Countries (crossing not communitarian nations) (for further information see: http://www.atacarnet.com/);
- 3) official veterinary health certificates on the International Form issued from the official veterinary health authorities of the Country of origin:
- a) <u>for horses from European Countries</u> see Annex II or Annex III of Council Directive 2009/156, please remember that these Annexes still in force only 10 days AND the addition of the horses in the TRACES system (Commission Decision 2004/292/EC);
- b) for Re-entry of registered horses after temporary export to approved non-EU countries from European Countries see commission implementing regulation (eu) 2018/659 and respective subsequent amendment (e.g. commission implementing regulation (eu) 2018/1301) c) for horses from NOT European Countries see commission implementing regulation (eu) 2018/659 and respective subsequent amendment (e.g. commission implementing regulation (eu) 2018/1301)

4. Injury Surveillance

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII:

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post mortem examination.

5. Transport Of Horses

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles f. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.



6. Venue Arrival Information & Fitness To Compete

6.1 Passports. FEI General Regulations

Article 137

For all Horses on FEI Passports/FEI Recognition Cards issues, please address to your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses in CIMs, in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (GRs. 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB: for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

6.2 Vaccinations - Equine InfluenzaFEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.



6.3 Examination On ArrivalFEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

6.4 Horse Inspections

FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1034-1042

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

6.5 Limb Sensitivity ExaminationFEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1048-1053

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

7 Equine Anti-Doping And Controlled Medication Programme (EADCMP). FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

7.1Sampling.

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

7.2 Elective Testing.

FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to http://inside.fei.org/fei/your-role/veterinarians for information and details.



7.3 Hyposensitivity Control System Examination FEI Veterinary Regulations, Annex VIII

All horses competing in FEI Endurance events are subject to Hyposensitivity Control System Examination. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of the Event and may be selected randomly and/or target tested by the Ground Jury and/or Veterinary Commission.

All horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination. A refusal by the PR or his/her representative to submit a horse for examination will lead to disqualification and a yellow warning card. Withdrawal of the horse is not allowed once the PR or support personnel has been notified that the examination is to take place.

XIV. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. THE FEI POLICY FOR ENHANCED COMPETITION SAFETY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The FEI Policy for Enhanced Competition Safety during the Covid-19 Pandemic ("Policy") https://inside.fei.org/fei/covid-19/return-to-play/policy-tools is mandatory and applies for any FEI Event taking place as of 1 July 2020. The Policy has been developed based on currently accepted best practices by the WHO and US Center for Disease Control (CDC) and will be continually reviewed and updated as more information becomes available. It is not intended to replace the applicable guidance and policies from domestic government and health authorities, but to supplement their recommendations with sport specific considerations.

The OC shall submit the risk assessment and mitigation plan (including name and contact details of the person in charge) to the FEI as an annex to the Event Schedule, at <u>the latest</u> ten (10) working days before the event's deadline for Definite Entries.

Events for which the FEI has not received the documented risk assessment and mitigation measures plan in accordance with article 2.1.g) of the Policy **will be removed from the FEI calendar** in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

- 1. Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
- The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,
- 3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
- 4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("RELEASEES"), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.

2. Insurances And National Requirements



In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate.

2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

2.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

2.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

2.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.



2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

2.2.2 Additional Liability Information

2.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

<u>FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians (PTVs) (Art 1005) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.</u>

3. Protests / Appeals

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF150. – or equivalent.

4. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. Modifications Of Schedule

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.

Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a results of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

Failure from ORGANISERs of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.

The FEI may request a copy of the official PDF result signed by the relevant Officials at the Event.



FEI Endurance Organisers' Protocol

With an aim to further ensure the welfare of equine and human athletes at International Endurance Events, the safety of all participants and the implementation and respect of common principles of behaviour, fairness, and sportsmanship, the FEI has created this FEI Endurance Organiser's Protocol (hereinafter the "Endurance Protocol") to guarantee the correct and full application of the applicable FEI Rules and Regulations in your Events, in particular but not limited to, the FEI General Regulations, the FEI Endurance Rules, the FEI Veterinary Regulations, the FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

In order for the FEI to approve the competition schedules the Endurance Protocol **must** be signed by the Organiser and the National Federation, listing the Event(s). By signing the Endurance Protocol both aforementioned parties agree to comply with all applicable FEI Rules and Regulations, and in particular (but not limited to), with the following requirements:

- 1. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Officials to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules, in particular:
 - Ground Jury Art. Art. 853
 - Technical Delegate Art. 852
 - Veterinary Commission Art. 854
 - Chief Steward Art. Art. 855
- 2. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Independent Governance Advisors (IGAs) to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules Art. 856
- 3. The welfare of the horse must be a first priority and you must allow the FEI Officials to take all necessary measures to safeguard it, as per the FEI Endurance Rules, including but not limited to:
 - Loops of the course must not be specially designed and/or constructed to encourage high speeds Art. 818
 - Allowing for the reduction of the pulse criteria Art. 816.9.2. The pulse criteria may be reduced during the ride if, in the opinion of the President of the Veterinary Commission in consultation with the Foreign Veterinary Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury and the Technical Delegate they believe there is a danger to the safety of the Horses.
 - The Veterinary Commission has absolute control on all matters concerning horse welfare Annex 5, Art.1.
 - The Technical Delegate or the Ground Jury together with the Veterinary Commission can decide to modify the length of timed holds according to extreme weather conditions or other exceptional circumstances.... Art. 816.9.3.



- 4. The safety of the athletes, FEI Officials and public must be safeguarded at all times and FEI Officials must be allowed to take all necessary measures to ensure safety, as per the FEI Endurance Rules/FEI GRs:
 - The field of play Art. 813
 - Number of crew members allowed Art. 813.2.2
 - Horses must remain capable of being clearly observed at all times Art. 813.5
 - Permitted Assistance during Event or on Course Art. 822.4
 - Prohibited Assistance Art. 822.5
 - Postponement and/or cancellation of an Event FEI GRs 109.12
- 5. The FEI Officials' Code of Conduct must be adhered to including the obligations and restrictions pertaining to the "Endurance Official's Per Diems".

Any breach of the FEI Rules and Regulations will be prosecuted according to the FEI Legal System (Chapter VIII of the FEI General Regulations).
