This Biosecurity plan is drawn up in accordance with the FEI Post EHV-1 Return to Competition Regulation set out on 9 April and extended from 1 January 2022 in order to allow the return to competitions and at the same time protect horses and equestrian sports from the consequences of infectious diseases transmitted before during and after FEI events. Assessment of the biological risk related to the sudden emergency linked to the spread of EHV-1

Given that Italy is one of the countries indicated by the FEI among those that need measures that allow the return to competitions in total safety in relation to the dangerous situations that have arisen in 2021 with the spread of the EHV-1 HERPES virus, this document was drawn up in order to define a set of preventive and protective measures aimed at minimizing the risk of contagion for the event to be held in Arezzo on 29 Aprile to 1 May 2022.

That said, the ASD has taken steps to take all the necessary measures to ensure the contrast and containment of the spread of the new virus, regulating it with this plan to make the event a "safe place" for the participating horses.

In this regard, all the necessary precautions are provided that must be adopted to counter the spread and contagion of the EHV-1 virus.

The contents of this document must be brought to the attention and acknowledged by anyone authorized to enter the event indicated above.

2. Introduction

2.1. Generic aspects,

The EHV virus occurs in 4 different types that affect 4 different systems of the horse, in this case the most lethal and contagious is that of type 1, in jargon EHV-1.

2.2 Symptoms of EHV-1

The most common form is type 1 which affects the respiratory system of the horse. In the most common form, it presents respiratory diseases with variable symptoms that include fever, nasal discharge, swollen lymph nodes, cough, loss of appetite and significant physiological drops, which are quite common symptoms and can be misleading and alarming those who observe the horse. In more serious cases, the Herpes Virus can also have repercussions from a neurological point of view, leading to paralysis and death.

2.2. Method of transmission

The EHV-1 virus, also known as Rhinopneumonia, has a very high viral load and is very easily transmitted by air, by direct contact between horses and also through surfaces that have come into contact with the viral components. For this reason, both sporting events and daily life in individual stables can be dangerous if the necessary precautions are not taken. It is possible, however, that horses spread the Equine Herpes Virus even without showing clinical signs (the so-called asymptomatic carriers), transmitting it only in certain environmental conditions such as stress, transport and competitions.

2.3 Diagnosis

Observing symptoms, especially at the respiratory level, cannot always lead to a correct diagnosis of rhinopneumonia, so in these cases it is categorically recommended to contact a veterinarian who can evaluate all the hypotheses. Using a classic swab or serological tests, it is possible to establish whether a respiratory infection is associated with EHV-1, by taking two blood samples 10 days apart on which the antibody titration is carried out.

2.4 Treatment and convelescence

The recommended treatment starts, first of all, with the isolation and quarantine of the person infected with the herpes virus. Unfortunately, being a virus, there is no specific and targeted cure. Treatment of equine herpes virus respiratory infections usually consists of supportive therapy, as human anti-herpes drugs are not effective in horses. Antipyretics and antitussives are administered, but also antibiotics to prevent or fight secondary bacterial infections, and to shorten the recovery period. However, with the help of a veterinary expert, a cure can be identified to treat the symptoms resulting from EHV-1 such as general weakness, loss of appetite and apathy. It is possible to preserve his respiratory health in a preventive manner through alternative methods recommended by us such as purified hay. However, in summary, the only remedies are prevention and the vaccine.

2.5 Prevention

- In order to reduce the incidence of EHV-1 infection and to minimize its spread, it is necessary to sanitize the living environments of horses combined with particularly thorough hygiene through disinfectants.
- The isolation of the horse and tools is mandatory in case of contact with the virus.
- The prevention of contagion depends on the probability that horses have of coming into contact with the virus emitted by a sick person or a healthy carrier (a healthy carrier is defined as the person who, even if contaminated, does not show symptoms or because it is too early to manifest them or because will never manifest being able to eliminate the virus autonomously).

5. Definition of liability

• In compliance with the provisions of the FEI, the Ministry of Health, the General Directorate of Animal Health and the FISE, the President identifies a method of control and management of the risk inherent in the event and informs the participants about the procedures for managing the risk inherent in the contagion and transmission of the EHV-1 virus

The participants in the competition, their assistants, the Staff, the Officials correctly informed by the President have the responsibility of respecting the behaviors defined by the regulations in force and by the rules laid down by the ASD with this document.

6. Risk HEV-1

Risk control is divided into three phases

RISK ASSESSMENT

Identification of the specificity of the structure and of the plants exercised in it, for which conditions can be created that link the actual or potential presence of the EHV-1 virus to the possibility of contracting the infection. This evaluation is carried out individually on each horse that will participate in the event

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RISK COMMUNICATION

All actions aimed at informing, training and raising awareness of the subjects concerned by the potential risk

Procedures for contrasting EHV-1 infection

No. 1 - Correct behaviour of the riders within the place of the event.

<u>Visitors must strictly comply with the instructions given by the O.C. which are considered accepted from the moment of registration to be made on www.enduranceonline.it.</u>

- Correct information and awareness of correct behaviour is considered the first and most important means of managing risk.
- The President will have to provide suitable signs, encouraging the dissemination of messages and raising awareness of behaviour.
- In order to inform and train the athletes and their assistants, the Judging Commission and all the staff, the person in charge makes information on the correct behaviour to prevent the spread of the EHV-1 virus visible in the Secretariat area
- The obligation to wash your hands with gel at the entrance and exit of the stables
- The obligation not to water horses on common containers but to use only their own containers
- The obligation to view this document in order to be properly informed about the procedures for fighting the infection
- The obligation to record the horse's temperature at least in the 3 days prior to the event in the FEI HORSE APP
- \bullet The obligation to measure and record the temperature twice a day in the FEI HORSE APP
- The obligation to observe the entry and exit from the stables as indicated by the O.C.
- \bullet The obligation to carefully observe the distance from other horses of at least 5 m.
- $\bullet \ \textit{The obligation to saddle the horse inside the assigned box and to use only personal harness}\\$
- $\bullet \ \textit{The obligation to send the box form by 24 April with the indication of the date and time of arrival}\\$

Any information the President deems useful for risk management.

Personal hygiene

Hand hygiene. The correct application of preventive measures, such as hand hygiene, can reduce the risk of infection.

The president provides special dispensers of alcoholic gels with an alcohol concentration of 60-85%,

Emergency procedure in case of entry into the center of a horse suspected of EHV-1

If a horse exhibits the symptoms of the HEV-1 virus, the VSM will immediately arrange the movement to the isolation area prepared in advance by the O.C. as per FEI provisions and will proceed with the provisions of the Veterinary Regulations.

The C.O. will arrange for the immediate disinfection of the box used.

Verification and review of the document consist in the evaluation of all the activities provided for in this document and implemented for the prevention and control of the HEV-1 risk, in order to evaluate their effectiveness. Therefore, the President will adapt this document to any regulatory changes that will occur from today's date to the date of carrying out the sporting event.



Il presente piano di Biosicurezza è redatto in conformità al Regolamento FEI Post EHV-1 Return to Competition disposto in data 9 Aprile e confermato a far data dal 1 Gennaio 2022 al fine di permettere il ritorno alle competizioni e contestualmente proteggere i cavalli e gli sport equestri dalle conseguenza delle malattie infettiva trasmesse prima durante e dopo gli eventi FEI.

Valutazione del rischio biologico correlato all'improvvisa emergenza legata alla diffusione del EHV-1

1. Scopo

Premesso che l'Italia rientra fra i paesi indicati dalla FEI fra quelli che necessitano di misure che permettano il ritorno alle competizioni in totale sicurezza in relazione alle situazioni di pericolo venutesi a creare nelle scorse settimane con la diffusione del virus EHV-1 HERPES VIRUS EQUINO, il presente documento è stato redatto al fine di definire un insieme di misure preventive e protettive atte a ridurre al minimo il rischio di contagio per l'evento che si terrà a Montalcino nei giorni dal 20-22-Maggio 2022

Ciò premesso, l' ASD si è attivata per adottare tutte le misure necessarie a garantire il contrasto ed il contenimento della diffusione del nuovo virus disciplinandolo con il presente piano per rendere l'evento un "luogo sicuro" per i cavalli partecipanti .

A tale riguardo, vengono forniti tutti gli accorgimenti necessari che devono essere adottati per contrastare la diffusione ed il contagio del virus EHV-1

Quanto contenuto nel presente documento dovrà essere portato a conoscenza e recepito da chiunque sarà autorizzato all'ingresso nell'evento sopra indicato

.2. Introduzione

2.1. Aspetti generici,

Il virus EHV si presenta in 4 tipi diversi che colpiscono 4 diversi apparati del cavallo, nella fattispecie il più letale e contagioso è quello di tipo 1, in gergo EHV-1.

2.2 Sintomi dell'EHV-1

La forma più diffusa è quella di tipo 1 che colpisce l'apparato respiratorio del cavallo. Nella forma più comune presenta patologie respiratorie con sintomi variabili che comprendono febbre, scolo nasale, ingrossamento dei linfonodi, tosse, inappetenza e notevoli cali fisiologici, che sono sintomi abbastanza comuni e possono trarre in inganno e allarmare chi osserva il cavallo. In casi più gravi, l'Herpes Virus può avere ripercussioni anche dal punto di vista neurologico, portando a paralisi e a morte.

2.2. Modalità di trasmissione

Il virus EHV-1, conosciuto anche come Rinopolmonite, ha una carica virale altissima e si trasmette molto facilmente per via aerea, per contatto diretto tra cavalli e anche attraverso superfici venute a contatto con i componenti virali. Per questo motivo, sia le manifestazioni sportive che la vita quotidiana nelle

singole scuderie possono risultare pericolose se non si prendono le dovute precauzioni. E' possibile, tuttavia, che i cavalli diffondano l'Herpes Virus equino anche senza mostrare segni clinici (i cosiddetti portatori asintomatici), trasmettendolo solo in determinate condizioni ambientali come stress, trasporto e competizioni.

2.3 Diagnosi

L'osservazione dei sintomi, specialmente a livello respiratorio, non sempre può condurre ad una corretta diagnosi della Rinopolmonite, per cui in questi casi è consigliato categoricamente di contattare un veterinario che possa vagliare tutte le ipotesi. Tramite un classico tampone o attraverso esami sierologici è possibile stabilire se un'infezione respiratoria è associata a EHV-1, prelevando due campioni di sangue a distanza di 10 giorni sui quali viene effettuata la titolazione anticorpale.

2.4 Cure e Convalescenza

Il trattamento consigliato parte, innanzitutto, dall'isolamento e la quarantena del soggetto contagiato dall'herpes virus. Purtroppo, essendo un virus, non esiste una cura specifica e mirata. Il trattamento delle infezioni respiratorie da Herpes Virus Equino è solitamente costituito da terapia di sostegno, poiché i farmaci anti-Herpes ad uso umano non sono efficaci nel cavallo. Vengono somministrati antipiretici ed antitussigeni, ma anche antibiotici per prevenire o combattere infezioni batteriche secondarie, e per ridurre il periodo di convalescenza. Tuttavia, con l'aiuto di un esperto veterinario, si può individuare una cura per trattare i sintomi sorti di conseguenza all'EHV-1 come indebolimento generale, inappetenza e l'apatia. E' possibile preservare la sua salute respiratoria in maniera preventiva attraverso metodi alternativi da noi consigliati come il fieno purificato. Tuttavia, ricapitolando, le uniche cure risolutive sono la prevenzione ed il vaccino.

2.5 Prevenzione

Al fine di ridurre l'incidenza dell'infezione da EHV-1 e per minimizzarne la diffusione è necessaria la sanificazione degli ambienti di vita dei cavalli abbinata ad un'igiene particolarmente profonda attraverso prodotti disinfettanti.

E' obbligatorio l'isolamento del cavallo e degli strumenti in caso di contatto con il virus.

La prevenzione del contagio dipende dalla probabilità che i cavalli hanno di entrare in contatto con il virus emesso da un soggetto malati o portatore sano (si definisce portatore sano il soggetto che pur se contaminato non manifesta sintomi o perché troppo presto per manifestarli o perché non li manifesterà mai essendo capace di eliminare il virus autonomamente).



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IV. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

2. **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

ENTRY OF HORSES

Required health tests and vaccinations: Quarantine period: Specimen Import Licence applied:

Required health tests and vaccinations:

All participating horses must be in possession of:

- 1) a declaration (with a detailed list) from their own NF stating that the same is temporarily imported into Italy to take part in (official name of the competition, date and address);
- 2) an ATA form, especially for extra European Countries or in the case the horse will pass through not EU Countries (crossing not communitarian nations) (for further information see: http://www.atacarnet.com/);
- 3) Apply to the competent Health Authority for Health Certificates for horses, based on the new EU Regulations currently in force. It is advisable to check with the Health Authority the formalities relating to the transport authorization also.

Absolutely necessary for national sanitary Authorities:

- 1. Horses coming from the rest of Italy: Transport (Model 4) and health certificate.
- 2. Horses coming from EU: International Transport Certificate valid between EU members.
- 3. Horses coming from other countries: Valid Certificate which is required at the moment



of entry.

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

COGGINS TEST COMPULSORY FOR HORSES RESIDENT IN ITALY (DM 02/02/2016)

4. PONIES

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX and Annex IX: For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post-mortem examination.

6. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

7. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations, Art. 137

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.



NB: Horses entered in CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (FEI General Regulations, Art. 137.2).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1 st Vaccination: day 0 2 nd Vaccination: day 21-92	May compete 7 days after the 2 nd Vaccination
First Booster	Within 7 months of the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course	May compete for 6 months +21 days after the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination
Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be in the 6 months +21 days of the booster previous vaccination	Must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1031

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1034-1042

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any



Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1048-1053 and Annex VIII

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, preride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP). FEI Regulations, Chapter VII

8.1 SAMPLING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses for information and details.

XIV. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

The ADRHA rules are published on the FEI's website at http://inside.fei.org/content/anti-doping-rules.



XV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. THE FEI POLICY FOR ENHANCED COMPETITION SAFETY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The FEI Policy for Enhanced Competition Safety during the Covid-19 Pandemic ("Policy") https://inside.fei.org/fei/covid-19/return-to-play/policy-tools is mandatory and applies for any FEI Event taking place as of 1 July 2020. The Policy has been developed based on currently accepted best practices by the WHO and US Center for Disease Control (CDC) and will be continually reviewed and updated as more information becomes available. It is not intended to replace the applicable guidance and policies from domestic government and health authorities, but to supplement their recommendations with sport specific considerations.

The OC shall submit the risk assessment and mitigation plan (including name and contact details of the person in charge) to the FEI as an annex to the Event Schedule, at the latest ten (10) working days before the event's deadline for Definite Entries.

Events for which the FEI has not received the documented risk assessment and mitigation measures plan in accordance with article 2.1.g) of the Policy **will be removed from the FEI calendar** in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

- Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
- 2. The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,
- 3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
- 4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("RELEASEES"), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.



2. Insurances And National Requirements

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the Organiser may change the schedule in order to clarify any matter arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Technical Delegate.

2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

2.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

2.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

2.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.



2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

2.2.2 Additional Liability Information

The event will respect the covid - 19 health protocol provided by the Ministry of Health and the NF for the contrast and containment of the virus covid 19. Our O.C.drew up the anti-contagion protocol attached here. 2.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians (PTVs) (Art 1005) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.

3. Protests / Appeals

To be valid, all Prostests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompagnied by a deposit of CHF150. – or equivalent.

4. Disputes

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. Modifications Of Schedule

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances.



Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a results of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the Foreign Judge.

Failure from ORGANISERs of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.

FEI Endurance Organisers' Protocol

With an aim to further ensure the welfare of equine and human athletes at International Endurance Events, the safety of all participants and the implementation and respect of common principles of behaviour, fairness, and sportsmanship, the FEI has created this FEI Endurance Organiser's Protocol (hereinafter the "Endurance Protocol") to guarantee the correct and full application of the applicable FEI Rules and Regulations in your Events, in particular but not limited to, the FEI General Regulations, the FEI Endurance Rules, the FEI Veterinary Regulations, the FEI Anti-Doping Rules for Human Athletes and the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations.

In order for the FEI to approve the competition schedules the Endurance Protocol **must** be signed by the Organiser and the National Federation, listing the Event(s). By signing the Endurance Protocol both aforementioned parties agree to comply with all applicable FEI Rules and Regulations, and in particular (but not limited to), with the following requirements:

- 1. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Officials to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules, in particular:
 - Ground Jury Art. 853
 - Technical Delegate Art. 852
 - Veterinary Commission Art. 854
 - Chief Steward Art. 855
- 2. Full cooperation must be given to the FEI Independent Governance Advisors (IGAs) to ensure that they can perform their tasks according to the FEI Endurance Rules Art. 856
- 3. The welfare of the horse must be a first priority and you must allow the FEI Officials to take all necessary measures to safeguard it, as per the FEI Endurance Rules, including but not limited to:
 - Loops of the course must not be specially designed and/or constructed to encourage high speeds Art. 818
 - Allowing for the reduction of the pulse criteria Art. 816.9.2. The pulse criteria may be reduced during the ride if, in the opinion of the President of the Veterinary Commission in consultation with the Foreign Veterinary Delegate, the President of the Ground Jury and the Technical Delegate they believe there is a danger to the safety of the Horses.
 - The Veterinary Commission has absolute control on all matters concerning horse welfare Annex 5, Art.1.
 - The Technical Delegate or the Ground Jury together with the Veterinary Commission can decide to modify the length of timed holds according to extreme weather conditions or other exceptional circumstances.... Art. 816.9.3.
- 3.1 If the Event combines a CEN(s) with a CEI(s), the Organiser will take all reasonable measures to ensure the biosecurity of the FEI Horses is safeguarded including but not limited to:
 - Ensure that FEI horses participating in the CEI are stabled separately from CEN horses participating in the CEN ride. If no stabling is required at your Event, please make sure they are separated in the cooling and holding areas.
 - The use of common water troughs for Horses is prohibited. Water must be drawn with a clean bucket. Horses must not drink directly from the trough.
 - Ensure that the examination upon arrival is done for all Horses according to article 1031 of



- It is advised that the temperature of CEN Horses is manually recorded 3 days prior to the event, and that this information is passed to the FEI Veterinarian that is carrying the Examination upon arrival.
- Ensure that all participants are advised to report any health issues to the FEI Veterinarian,
 so that Horse can be isolated and further testing can be done.
- Ensure that the veterinarians have enough sanitizers and gloves for the Horse inspections throughout the day.

*Please refer to the CEI_CEN Biosecurity Measures Leaflet for more information.

- 4. The safety of the athletes, FEI Officials and public must be safeguarded at all times and FEI Officials must be allowed to take all necessary measures to ensure safety, as per the FEI Endurance Rules/FEI GRs:
 - The field of play Art. 813
 - Number of crew members allowed Art. 813.2.2
 - Horses must remain capable of being clearly observed at all times Art. 813.5
 - Permitted Assistance during Event or on Course Art. 822.4
 - Prohibited Assistance Art. 822.5
 - Postponement and/or cancellation of an Event FEI GRs 109.12
- 5. The FEI Officials' Code of Conduct must be adhered to including the obligations and restrictions pertaining to the "Endurance Official's Per Diems".

Any breach of the FEI Rules and Regulations will be prosecuted according to the FEI Legal System (Chapter VIII of the FEI General Regulations). Failure by an Organiser to comply with the terms of this Protocol may also lead to sanctions including the removal of future events from the FEI Calendar in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.
